### YEAR 3


This week the children have been looking at a new story for our writing unit. Cinderella of the Nile. We have picked it apart for some vocabulary and then acted out some of the parts.

Pupils used a range of different materials and pieces of equipment to see if it will power their circuit.










### YEAR 5

#### A Message from Steph, our Attendance and Welfare Officer **Holidays** in term time

To request that your child is absent from school for a holiday, please complete an S2 form, these can be picked up from the school office. Ensure that you specify any exceptional circumstances. You will receive confirmation of whether the absence will be authorised or not. If you take your child out for a holiday during term time that has not been previously authorised, you make yourselves liable to receiving a Penalty Notice per parent/carer, per child. Also please note that the Local Authority will only issue 1 Penalty Notice in any 2 year period so a second holiday in that time would result in a Court Summons.


### JOIN PIP, ZENA AND LIBRO ON THEIR NEW ONLINE ADVENTURE





#### Tom Gates Book of Everything by Liz Pichon

#### **ATTENDANCE**

#### **CPOMS** and Operation encompass

At OLSP we use CPOMs as our system for recording information that we consider to be safeguarding information. As a parent you are entitled to see this information and may request to do so.

Operation Encompass is the reporting to schools, prior to the start of the next school day, when a child or young person has exposed to, or involved in, any domestic incident.

Operation Encompass will ensure that a member of the school staff, known as a Key Adult, is trained to allow them to liaise with the police and to use the information that has been shared, in confidence, while ensuring that the school is able to make provision for possible difficulties experienced by children, or their families, who have been involved in, or exposed to, a domestic abuse incident.
