The Saint Behind the Day


Today the children have celebrated this patron saint's day by wearing the clothes that they love. We all know about Valentine's Day, but the saint behind the day is more obscure, partly because very little is actually known about Saint Valentine. Pope Gelasius I, who made February 14 Valentine's feast day, rightly said:

"Saint Valentine is one of those whose names are justly reverenced among men, but whose acts are known only to God." Valentine lived in the third century and his name comes from the Latin word valens meaning worthy, strong, or powerful. Valentine was martyred around the year 269. His Feast Day is 14th February, and he is the patron Saint of love, young people, and happy marriages.

During the year, we sometimes forget to tell our parents, children, wider families and friends that we love them. We sometimes neglect to tell people who have helped us how much we appreciate their help. Valentine's Day might be a good day to contact those people we've neglected and let them know how much they mean to us. In the midst of all the sentimentality and celebration we should remember what love really is. Love means putting others before ourselves and loving them as Christ loved us. Jesus showed us, through His death what it really means to love. However, this doesn't make love a morbid, dismal sentiment. After all, Jesus rose on the third day!







CPOMS and Operation encompass

At OLSP we use CPOMs as our system for recording information that we consider to be safeguarding information. As a parent you are entitled to see this information and may request to do so.

Operation Encompass is the reporting to schools, prior to the start of the next school day, when a child or young person has exposed to, or involved in, any domestic incident.

Operation Encompass will ensure that a member of the school staff, known as a Key Adult, is trained to allow them to liaise with the police and to use the information that has been shared, in confidence, while ensuring that the school is able to make provision for possible difficulties experienced by children, or their families, who have been involved in, or exposed to, a domestic abuse incident.
