EARLY YEARS

The children have loved using the new and re-vamped outside area and equipment. We have a new sensory space, chalk boards and as you will have noticed a new larger water area. We have been exploring how we can get the water to 'travel' from one area to another.







YEAR 1 & 2

In Mars class we have been learning about the human body. We began singing, 'Heads, shoulders, knees and toes' which we all knew really well! Next, we used play-doh to make a human body and then we labelled the different parts of the body. Finally, some of us thought about the five senses and which body part allows us to use each sense.







YEAR 3

This week we have been looking at reconciliation and baptism as part of our 'SHE unit. We looked at why people get paptised and what happens when people go to confession. We all wrote our own confession candles praying to God about what we are sorry for and asking God for forgiveness.



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YEAR 4

In Saturn, the children have been decorating functional art pieces using natural materials from the school's playground and field. The children had a choice on choosing which functional form they could decorate.

All of the children had fantastic, innovative ideas which was great to see how they decorated a functional form.







1EAR 5

For the past two weeks we have learning about world trade with a focus on the trade between the USA and the UK. We looked in detail at what we export and import.

We have finished our English unit referencing Kensuke's Kingdom where year 5 have been learning to show emotions, feelings and atmosphere by showing not telling. We also played our first touch rugby game in PE. Year 5 are a competitive class demonstrating good teamwork.



Year 6 have been learning lots about World War II, with a focus on how the war began. They have learnt about the prime ministers; Neville Chamberlain and Winston Churchill. The children completed some learning about the impact Winston Churchill had on World War II. They created non-chronological reports about Winston Churchill. ASTHMA AWARENESS

Asthma affects more than 300 million people worldwide including 11.6% of children aged 6 to 7 years. In the UK, over 8 million people, or approximately 12% of the population, have been diagnosed with asthma.

- 1 million children in the UK are receiving treatment for asthma.
- Less than 25% of children with asthma have a personalised asthma action plan (PAAP).
- Nearly half have had an asthma attack in the previous year.
- 30% have had daytime symptoms in the previous week

Please make the school aware if your child has asthma or symptoms of asthma. We ask that 2 reliever inhalers are provided to school, one to be kept in the classroom and 1 in the school office. If you have any issues getting an inhaler due to supply issues please let us know.



If you would like to discuss your child's health needs please make an appointment with Mrs O'Sullivan or Mrs Emmerton via the

school office.

Always inform the school office of any changes to conditions or medication.

Any children in school with known medical conditions or allergies have their own Health Care Plan drawn up alongside parents and other professionals. Which details the risks and what to do in an emergency. <u>https://www.nhs.uk/conditions/asthma/</u>

At OLSP we use CPOMs as our system for recording information that we consider to be safeguarding information. As a parent you are entitled to see this information and may request to do so.

Operation Encompass is the reporting to schools, prior to the start of the next school day, when a child or young person has exposed to, or involved in, any domestic incident.

Operation Encompass will ensure that a member of the school staff, known as a Key Adult, is trained to allow them to liaise with the police and to use the information that has been shared, in confidence, while ensuring that the school

is able to make provision for possible difficulties experienced by children, or their families, who have been involved in, or exposed to, a domestic abuse incident.
