	<p>Homework</p>	<p><u>Set on a Wednesday and collected in on a Tuesday</u></p> <p><u>English:</u> The children will be set a grammar worksheet linking into gaps identified. Each week, the children receive a list of up to 10 words which will focus on practising spelling rules.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> → Weekly spelling tests take place on Wednesdays. → Please make sure regular practice takes place at home. → The children are provided with 'Look, cover, write, check' sheets to aid practice. <p><u>Maths:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • A half arithmetic maths practise SATs paper will be sent home weekly. <p><u>Reading:</u> <i>Children should read for a minimum of ten minutes every evening.</i></p>
	<p>Reading for Pleasure</p>	<p>This half term we will continue with Holes and when this is finished we will be reading Thief by Malorie Blackman.</p>
	<p>English</p>	<p>For writing, the children will be focusing on The Place For Me: Stories about the Windrush generation by Dame Floella Benjamin et al.</p> <p>.</p> <p>Each week, the children will have spelling lessons to support their understanding of the spelling rules. Alongside this, the children will be focusing on how to spell and use the year 5 and 6 expected spelling word list to ensure they are year 7 ready at the end of the academic year.</p>
	<p>Maths</p>	<p>The children will be consolidating their knowledge of fractions. This unit is important because it develops children's understanding of fractions, moving on to comparing, adding and subtracting unrelated fractions using common denominators. It encourages problem solving of fraction problems while exploring efficient methods.</p>
	<p>RE</p>	<p>When completed the children will move on to 'vocation and commitment'. The children will reflect on how they are marked by many different experiences of being welcomed into new situations and groups.</p>

	Science	<p>Light is the children's new focus for learning. The questions they will be investigating is; How can I change the direction of light?</p> <p>The children will use the idea that light travels in straight lines to explain why shadows have the same shape. The children will explain that objects are seen because they give out or reflect light into the eye. The children will be able to explain that we see things because light travels from light sources to our eyes or from light sources to objects and then to the eye.</p>
 DT	DT	<p>The children will be learning about seasonal food. The children will be researching festive food themed around Christmas. The children will make a festive item of food to celebrate Christmas.</p>
	RHE	<p>I can be Anything. The focus will be to support the children's understanding of different people's jobs and nurture their aspirations for their own careers.</p>
	PE	<p>Every week, a PE lesson will be held on a Friday by a specialist PE teacher, the focus will be Hockey.</p> <p>Each Tuesday, the children will be taught by the class teacher. The focus this half-term is Multi-Skills.</p> <p>Make sure / check your child brings in their PE kit each week. Please make sure it is labelled with their name and surname.</p>
	Computing	<p>Online safety is the key focus for this term. Children will know what 'digital footprint' means (the information that exists on the internet as a result of a person's online activity), what steps are required to capture bullying content as evidence, they will understand that it is important to manage personal passwords effectively and know some common online scams.</p>
	Spanish	<p>The children will be learning how to verbalise Spanish words based on the school environment. The children will use songs, repetition and recall to learn words linked to school such as equipment.</p>
