HEAD TEACHER UPDATE

It has been lovely to see many of our parents in school this week and catching you up on how your children are getting on. I hope you found the meetings informative and useful.

You will have noticed that we have had the community police at our school gates a few times over the past couple of weeks. This is because we have had a few reports regarding unsafe practices. Safeguarding our children is of extreme importance to us and our goal is to ensure that all children get to school and back home safely each day. Here are a few essential reminders and updates for safe driving practices around the school grounds.

Seatbelts and Booster Seats: Know the Law

It's crucial to follow the law when it comes to seatbelt and booster seat requirements. According to the **law**, all children must be properly secured in a car seat, booster seat, or seatbelt, depending on their age, weight, and height:

- Children under the age of 2 (or under 30 pounds) must be in a rear-facing car seat.
- Children from 2 to 4 years old (and under 40 pounds) should be in a forward-facing car seat.
- Children ages 4 to 8 (and under 4'9" tall) should be in a booster seat.
- Children 8 years or older (or over 4'9" tall) must use a seatbelt.

Please make sure that your child is in the appropriate restraint before leaving for school. These laws are designed to protect our children in the event of an accident and are non-negotiable.

No U-Turns in the School Drive

To help with traffic flow and minimize risks, we ask that parents **do not make U-turns** in the school's driveway. U-turns create unnecessary hazards, especially with pedestrians and other vehicles in close proximity.

Use the designated path to enter the school grounds

There is never a situation when children should be walked up the hill via the car park. We have a designated path that keeps everyone safe and we ask that all use it. Please note this also applies when children are attending after school clubs, including Footlights Dance Academy on a Monday evening.

Your Cooperation Makes a Difference

We ask for your continued cooperation in these efforts. Together, we can make the school's arrival and dismissal times as safe and efficient as possible for our children. Please take a moment to review these important safety tips with your child to help them understand the importance of safety in and around the car.

Thank you for your attention to this matter, and let's work together to keep our school community safe!


An intercession for the second Sunday of Lent from CAFOD

CPOMS and Operation encompass

At OLSP we use CPOMs as our system for recording information that we consider to be safeguarding information. As a parent you are entitled to see this information and may request to do so.

Operation Encompass is the reporting to schools, prior to the start of the next school day, when a child or young person has exposed to, or involved in, any domestic incident.

Operation Encompass will ensure that a member of the school staff, known as a Key Adult, is trained to allow them to liaise with the police and to use the information that has been shared, in confidence, while ensuring that the school

is able to make provision for possible difficulties experienced by children, or their families, who have been involved in, or exposed to, a domestic abuse incident.
