Apologies that we needed to postpone the sports day. The weather is looking better for next week so fingers crossed all will be fine.


Just slightly less than two weeks left and we still have so much going on. I look forward to seeing you all next Friday after school when we have our traditional OLSP Barbecue.

A Message from Steph, our Attendance and Welfare Officer

You will have received your child's report and a copy of their attendance, called a registration certificate. I have had several conversations with parents who are confused about the number of days that their child has been absent.

Each day, attendance is recorded is two sessions, AM and PM, therefore each day there are two possible sessions. Your child's registration certificate will show how many sessions they have attended or been absent. For example, if your child has accrued 12 sessions of illness this year, this equates to 6 days.



At OLSP we use CPOMs as our system for recording information that we consider to be safeguarding information. As a parent you are entitled to see this information and may request to do so.

Operation Encompass is the reporting to schools, prior to the start of the next school day, when a child or young person has exposed to, or involved in, any domestic incident.

Operation Encompass will ensure that a member of the school staff, known as a Key Adult, is trained to allow them to liaise with the police and to use the information that has been shared, in confidence, while ensuring that the school

is able to make provision for possible difficulties experienced by children, or their families, who have been involved in, or exposed to, a domestic abuse incident.
